Your president will have cards you need to fill out before you bring your entry on the 25th. Winners will be eligible for the KEHA contest during the state meeting in Lexington on May 6-8. If you plan on entering the writing contest, your entry needs to be sent to the person in charge (check KEHA website) by March 1.

On February 26, a lesson on "Indoor Air Quality" will be presented at the Extension Office at 10 am. Anyone may attend this—you do not have to be a member of GCEH, so invite your friends and neighbors. I think we are more aware of the quality of our air during the winter when our heat is running and our houses are more closed. We have a humidifier we use in the winter because our house is so dry. Hopefully, this lesson will teach us how to have a higher quality of air in our homes.

We also have our regular club meetings and our lesson will be about exercising. TLC club meets at the Extension Office on February 12 (second Wednesday) at 10 am. Friendship club meets at Farmington Church of Christ Fellowship Building on February 12 (second Wednesday) at 1 pm. One very dark, early morning around 5:30 a.m., when time to feed my cat, I walked to the storage shed where I kept the cat food bag in a trash can.



Egg Roll in a Bowl

Ingredients:

1 tablespoon oil
1 pound ground turkey or pork
2 teaspoons garlic powder
1 teaspoon ground ginger
1/4 cup low-sodium soy sauce
1 bag coleslaw mix (with carrots)
1 whole egg



Directions:

Wash hands with warm water and soap, scrubbing for at least 20 seconds.

Heat oil in a large skillet over medium heat.

Add the ground meat to the skillet and break it up until it is cooked through and has reached an internal temperature of 165 degrees F on a food thermometer. Drain any fat from the meat.

Add garlic, ginger, and soy sauce to the meat, and stir to combine.

Add coleslaw mix to the cooked meat. Cook until vegetables are tender.

Push mixture in the skillet to make a hole. Crack the egg in the open area, and scramble it until it is cooked through.

Stir all ingredients together and serve.

Store leftovers in the refrigerator within 2 hours.


